Community Facilities & Services

SECTION 5: COMMUNITY FACILITIES, UTILITIES AND SERVICES

This section of the master plan provides vital information on municipal community facilities such as schools, recreational land, library facilities, municipal administration facilities, police and fire.

Municipal Complex

The municipal complex is located at 525 Pompton Avenue on 4.44 acres of land which is bisected by the Peckman River. The complex houses all municipal services including the police department and public library. The complex is adjacent to the local United State Post office and is a little over 2 miles south of the municipal with Little Falls (along Prospect Ave) and 1 mile north of the municipal boundary with Verona.



Public School Facilities

The Township of Cedar Grove Board of Education operates two elementary schools serving grades kindergarten through grade four and one middle school serving grades six through eight. Students in grades nine through twelve go to the Cedar Grove High School. Essex County operates a County wide special needs public school located within the municipal boundary.

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South End Elementary School

The South End Elementary School educated students from kindergarten through the fourth grade. It is accessible from Oak Place and occupies 11.1 acres. In the 2018, this school educated 311 students. Of the 311 students, 19.3 percent are classified with some form of disability and 1.7 percent are listed as being economically disadvantaged. The student to teacher ratio is 12:1 and the average teacher has 10.3 years of experience.







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North End Elementary School

The South End Elementary School educated students from kindergarten through the fourth grade. The school is accessible from Stevens Avenue and occupies 12.5 acres. In 2018 the school educated 250 students. Of the 25- students, 22 percent are classified with some form of disability and 2 percent are listed as being economically disadvantaged. The student to teacher ratio was 8:1 and the average teacher had 13.6 years of experience.





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
Cedar Grove High School

The Cedar Grove High School educated students from the ninth grade through the twelfth grade. The school is accessible from Rugby Road. In 2018 this school educated 513 students. Of the 513 students, 13.9 percent are classified with some form of disability and 2.3 percent are listed as being economically disadvantaged. The school had a student to teacher ratio of 12:1 in 2018. The average teacher had 11.3 years of experience.

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Essex Jr. Academy

Essex Junior Academy is a public special education school currently serving classified and alternative students in grades K-12. Instruction is provided in reading and language arts, mathematics, science, health, social studies, life skills, and technology. Essex Junior Academy, established in 1986, is a countywide Special and Alternative Education Program designed to serve students seeking an alternative to the traditional educational method.

EJA helps students who may be in danger of not graduating with their class due to chronic discipline problems, adjudication, self-abusive or drug involved behaviors. Student enrollment for the past years are as follows:

The Saint Catherine of Siena School is located at 39 East Bradford Avenue and offers pre-kindergarten through grade eight. Total enrollment is around 250 students with a student teacher ratio of 8:1. Faculty and staff comprise 47 persons. Each grade is one class and preschool has up to two classes per grade.



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

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

Municipal Services

Library



The Cedar Grove Free Public Library is dedicated to providing access to books and other materials, resources, and services for education, information, and recreation to all individuals and groups in the community on a fair and equitable basis.

The small staff operate the library six days a week at different times. The library also provides access to computers for primarily research, education, and job searches.

Police

The Cedar Grove Police Department is committed to providing quality service with the highest level of professionalism and integrity.

The Cedar Grove Police Department is dedicate to protect the lives, property, and rights of people, to maintain order, and to enforce the law impartially by working in partnership with the community.

The Cedar Grove Police Department is guided by its Chief of Police who supervises five lieutenants, four sergeants, two detectives, and eighteen patrol officers.

Ambulance Rescue Squad



The mission of the Cedar Grove Ambulance and Rescue Squad is to provide emergency medical care and rescue services to all those in need. The Cedar Grove Ambulance and Rescue Squad fosters the education of those in the emergency medical services by continuing education classes and promotes the education of the citizens of Cedar Grove through community outreach events.

Equipment

The following represents the current equipment utilized by the Cedar Grove Emergency Services Department.

Rescue 77



Rescue 77 is a 2000 Spartan Custom heavy rescue truck equipped for extrication, high angle rescue, confined space, mass casualty and more. Members are highly trained in the use of the equipment on this vehicle. Rescue 77 also carries a computer system with information on all vehicles electrical systems, air bags and other devices. This assists the squad members in proper extrication of patients.

791 Ambulance



791 is a 2005 Ford E-350 Horton Ambulance. The three ambulances are identically equipped with the most up to date EMS equipment. Each rig also carries a computer for patient data and a printer for printing patient information for the hospital staff.

794 is a 2003 Ford Crown Victora used as a first response/command vehicle by officers of the squad. The officers will oversee the call and direct members during the call.

Fire Department

The Cedar Grove Fire Department is a volunteer organization with four fire stations located throughout the Township. They protect well over 12,000 people within 4.5 square miles and are actively involved with surrounding fire departments providing mutual aid wherever and whenever possible. The staff is guided by a Department Chief who supervises two Deputy Chiefs, three Company Captains, three Company Lieutenants, and one tech rescue Lieutenant.

Brush Truck 75

Brush Truck 75 is a 2005 Ford F350. It's the primary response unit for all brush and wildland fires. This utility vehicle has a pump, 250 gallon tank with 3/4" booster line and carries a wide array of hand tools and saws. In addition, this vehicle is equipped to haul the Special Operations Trailer to Technical Rescue situations when needed. Truck 75 is stationed at Center Fire Company #1.



Engine 71

Engine 71 is a 2010 Pierce PUC Style Engine, housed at Center Fire Company #1, is a pumper as well as a rescue vehicle as it is equipped with tools for vehicle extrication and forcible entry. 71 is outfitted with two 2" pre-connect attack lines of 200 feet each, and a 1 3/4" pre-connect line of 150 feet used to flow foam at car fires. It has 5" and 3" supply line, ground ladders, miscellaneous hand tools, various saws and 40 gallons of foam. This engine holds 500 gallons of water, and is capable of pumping 1500 gallons of water a minute.

Engine 73

Engine 73, located at South End Fire Company #3, is a pumper. Engine 73 is equipped with two 2" pre-connect attack lines of 200 feet each, and a 1 3/4" pre-connect line of 150 feet used to flow foam at car fires. It has 5" and 3" supply line, ground ladders, miscellaneous hand tools, various saws and 40 gallons of foam. This engine holds 500 gallons of water, and is capable of pumping 1500 gallons of water a minute.



Special Operations Trailer

The Special Operations Trailer is a 2006 Atlas Trailer. Its primary purpose is for trench rescue operations. The trailer contains numerous specialty tools including Para Tech Rescue Struts, Air Bags, and Life Rescue Ropes. The trailer is equipped with a generator and also carries a full array of hand tools and lumber. Cedar Grove Fire Department is a member of a joint trench rescue team along with the Montclair, North Caldwell, and Roseland Fire Departments. The Special Operations Trailer is housed at Station 4.

Truck 74



Truck 74 is a 2005 Pierce Ariel Ladder. With a truck mounted aerial device, ground ladders, pump, hand lines and supply line, Truck 74 is a true Quint. Housed at Center Fire Company #1, Truck 74 has a 105 foot ladder with elevated water streams. It is equipped with tools for forcible entry, and carries a wide range of ground ladders, miscellaneous hand tools, various saws, and fans. This truck holds 500 gallons of water and is capable of pumping 1500 gallons of water a minute. This vehicle responds first to the scene of any/all incidents within Cedar Grove.

Truck 76

Truck 76 is a 2012 Ford F-550. It is a multi-purpose department vehicle. The vehicles primary purpose is towing the department's special operation trailer. However whenever a department apparatus is out of service Truck 76 stands in its place to ferry men and equipment to the scene of an emergency. Truck 76 is housed at Station
