# 1. ROLL CALL, INVOCATION AND FLAG SALUTE

Mayor Maceri called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM.

c) To consider resolution concerning the insertion of an item of special revenue in the amount of \$9,500.00 from the Municipal Alliance Grant.

**WHEREAS,** N.J.S.A. 40A:4-87, provides that the Director of Local Government Services may approve the insertion of a special item of revenue in the Municipal Budget of the Township of Cedar Grove for 2022 when such items shall have been available by law and the amount thereof was not determined at the time of adoption of the budget; and

**WHEREAS,** said Director may also approve the insertion of any item of appropriation of equal amount;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Township Council of the Township of Cedar Grove, Essex County, New Jersey, that it hereby requests that the Director of the Division of Local Government Services to approve the insertion of an item of revenue in the budget in the sum of \$9,500.00 which is now available as a revenue from the Municipal Alliance, which is administered by the Governor's Council on Alcoholism and Drug Abuse, pursuant to the provision of statute; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that a like sum of \$9,500.00 is hereby appropriated under the caption:

Municipal Alliance Grant \$9,500.00

Deputy Mayor Zichelli indicated that residents always asked if the Township applied for grants. He said this was the second grant that the Township received. He indicated the first grant was from the Body Worn Camera Grant Program. He explained these grants added to the revenue side of the budget.
