PUBLIC MEETING

MINUTES

JULY 1, 2024

1. ROLL CALL AND FLAG SALUTE

Mayor Peterson called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Present: Councilmembers Maceri, Mega, Zazzali, Deputy Mayor Skabich, Mayor Peterson

Also Present: Township Manager Zichelli, Township Attorney Lagana, and Township Clerk Forde

The flag salute was led by Mayor Peterson.

Mayor Peterson made the required announcement concerning the Open Public Meetings Act as follows: Adequate notice of this meeting was duly provided to the Verona-Cedar Grove Times and the Star Ledger on December 14, 2023, filed with the Township Clerk, and posted on the public bulletin board in the Municipal Building Lobby in accordance with the Open Public Meeting Act.

2. EXTRAORDINARY BUSINESS OF THE TOWNSHIP COUNCIL

(a) To consider resolution designating the Mayor.

The following resolution had been posted on the bulletin board, and a brief synopsis was given by the Township Clerk:

Township Manager Joseph Zichelli administered the oath of office to Michele Mega.

(c) Presentation of Plaque to Outgoing Mayor

Mayor Skabich presented a plaque to outgoing Mayor Peterson. Mayor Skabich stated that Kerry was all heart, and challenged everyone in this room to find someone who loved Cedar Grove more than Kerry. She stated it was her honor to serve as her Deputy Mayor, and even though Councilwoman Peterson and she were fellow shorties that Councilwoman Peterson left very big shoes to fill.

(d) Comments from Councilmembers.

Mayor Skabich made the following remarks:

“Good Evening everyone and thank you for coming to the Town Council’s Reorganization meeting. To our LD40 representatives; Senator Corrado and Assemblyman Barlas, thank you for being here today. We have our Department Heads; Chief of Police John Kennedy, Tax Collector Chris Tufaro, CFO Rebecca Roth, Tax Assessor Rich Hamilton and Construction Official James Hoffman. Thank you all for being here.

Every year at this meeting we provide a recap of relevant issues in town, the progress we’ve made, and what to expect from the year ahead. I’m going to do my best to keep this very short so we can all get to the fireworks. But first, I want to start by thanking family and friends for being here, especially my husband Paul for his support and for holding down the fort while I’m serving the great Township of Cedar Grove. Thank you for standing by me through thick and thin, especially when I don’t make it easy. I also want to thank my children, Paulie, Chris, Evan, and Estelle for being the best four kids I could’ve ever imagined. I love you, I’m so proud of you, and I’m thankful for you every day.

And to the incoming Deputy Mayor, Michelle Mega, another lifelong Cedar Grove resident who has dedicated most of her life to serving the Township, I am so happy for the opportunity to work together and continue to do great things for Cedar Grove.

To Joe Maceri, who brings calm to stressful situations even when he doesn’t realize it. I’ve learned so much about leadership serving alongside you. Joe doesn’t know this, but when I’m

feeling stressed, I often ask myself, 'What would Joe Maceri do,' or WWJMD for short, and it always works. I encourage you all to try it.

To John Zazalli, it's been a joy getting to know you and your beautiful family over the past year plus that we've served together. I think it's fair to say that John is the quiet one of the group, but I've been lucky enough to learn that John is also hilarious and apparently an excellent cook. I bring up the latter as a not-so-subtle attempt to score an invite to a Zazzali family cookout.

To our amazing Town Clerk, Dale Forde, thank you for the great honor of swearing me in today. I asked Dale not only because she's an absolute treasure, but because every conversation I've ever had with Dale has made my heart happy. Her relentless kindness, empathy, and willingness to go above and beyond for us, and for the Township, is an inspiration.

To our tireless Town Manager, Joe Zichelli, watching you take on this role with such boundless energy, well, quite frankly, it makes me tired. Joe is literally everywhere. He's at his desk responding to emails from our residents. He's at the scene of a fallen tree sending us texts at 11 at night. He's driving around with DPW letting us know what streets are being plowed and in what order. Simply put, Joe is a force of nature. To say that we are lucky to have him is an understatement, but I'm going to say it anyway. We are lucky to have you, Joe. Thank you for all you do for Cedar Grove and congratulations on your recent engagement to Kate.

To our LD40 representatives, Senator Corrado, Assemblyman DePhillips who couldn't be here, and Assemblyman Barlas, thank you for always having our backs and for consistently showing up for Cedar Grove. We appreciate your partnership in government and look forward to many more years of working together.

Before I go into some of the projects that the Township completed over the past year, I want to recognize our town hall staff, DPW employees, our volunteer fire department, Cedar Grove Police Department, the Montclair Ambulance Unit, and the Cedar Grove Volunteer Ambulance and Rescue Squad. Without all of these individuals, the projects the Township undertakes would never move past ideation. These are the people that turn words into action, and we are so thankful for their dedication to Cedar Grove.

2023 Recapitulation

Ok, so onto the recap of the last year. I'd like to start with upgrades to our recreational facilities, namely a \$40,000 upgrade to the pump at the Town Pool and a complete renovation of the basketball courts on Little Falls Road, which looks absolutely amazing. We are also thrilled to have secured a \$750,000 NJDEP Grant to replace the lower playground at Community Park, so that's another exciting project on the horizon. While I'm on the topic of grants, with the help of our fantastic Township Engineer Lexie Handel, we secured two separate NJDOT grants totaling \$748,000 for the reconstruction of Carlson Parkway and paving of Devonshire Road. This year, we have already paved Ira and David Road and are about to begin Brunswick Road. The Township continues to work closely with PSE&G on a gas main replacement and paving partnership. For this upcoming year, we have allocated \$320,000 to the Road Overlay program. On top of this, the Township will repair a defective storm water pipe traversing an easement on Bowden Road. We take on these projects with the goal of keeping our roads and infrastructure in the best shape possible for our residents. We've also been busy replacing water mains, this year on Rutgers Avenue, and soon on Briarhill, and we made repairs to the sewer treatment

plant equalization tank. This Council also passed an ordinance back in April to allocate money from the Capital Improvement Fund for the purchase and installation of new water meters—a project that is well underway.

For our outstanding fire department, construction on the brand-new North End Fire House is underway. And while this project is moving along slower than any of us would like, we know that the end result will be a state-of-the-art building that will house the North End Fire Department for generations to come. Cedar Grove in 2023 has made significant improvements to benefit the selfless men and women of the Cedar Grove Police Department, namely, approving funds to upgrade to the police desk, all new body armor for patrol, new lighting packages on police vehicles, and a very cool police drone.

All of these projects, and there are many more that I didn't touch upon today, are reflective of our prudent budget management. This year, even though interest rates continue to skyrocket, the Township once again paid down more debt than was required. On average, each household saw a \$67.43 tax increase on the municipal end, which equates to just \$5.62 per month. We are really proud of that number, and of the fact that Cedar Grove buys only what we need, which is why we have one of the lowest tax rates in Essex County.

And with that, I want to say that I consider myself very fortunate to serve with such an inspiring and dedicated group of public servants, and I will never take that for granted. Public service isn't for the faint of heart. And while I could look back on the past three years and list the many challenges we've faced together; I would much rather look ahead with excitement about what this next year will bring.

I want to conclude my remarks by asking a personal favor to our residents. We are about to enter what is sure to be a divisive national election, and this will be a big year for local elections as well. No matter what side of the aisle you're on, please remember that we are all part of the same wonderful community. We all visit the same parks, shop at the same stores, and our children learn in the same schools. So before you click send on a nasty email or put up a snarky post on social media, I encourage you to pick up the phone and call us. Or stop by one of our Meet the Mayor events, which I will shamelessly plug, and say that the first one will take place on Monday, July 29th at 9:30am. And while we might not always agree, more often than not we will find that we share some common ground. So be good to each other, Cedar Grove. Thank you."

Deputy Mayor Mega made the following remarks:

"Good evening, everyone here and at home. Thank you to those who were able to make it here tonight. It is an honor to sit up and represent the people of Cedar Grove as your new Deputy Mayor. Thank you, to this Council, that have faith in me to elect me for this very important role. I am very thankful to thee residents that voted to elect me as Councilwoman last year and put their trust in me to take on this leadership position in our community. I am also very thankful for the support of my family and friends. Thank you to my husband Tom, our daughter Alyssa and our son Nick. They all thoroughly enjoy politics or maybe not, but they do support me. It can get a little crazy at times. Maybe I do not always cook because I am out at a meeting. Maybe I do not always clean because I am out at another event, but that's okay because those are overrated anyway. I do appreciate the support you all give to me doing what I am meant to

do. I owe thanks to my parents and my in-laws for their continued support as well. At times, they also think I might be a little crazy, but that's okay. They support me regardless. To me, volunteering really is very rewarding. When you see the positive impact, you can have on your community. With the right group of people to work with what can be challenging can also be manageable and a great experience. I think this Town Council, the Township Manager, Clerk and Attorney are a great team to work with.

Thank you to this entire Council for all you have done and continue to do for the residents of Cedar Grove. Your commitment to this town is incredible and it is very much appreciated. Cedar Grove is lucky to have excellent leadership and dedicated elected officials - which you all are. I appreciate all the help you have given me personally in this role of being on the Council. You all have different strengths and have guided me in many ways. Your patience with me, as you know I can ask many questions, is very much appreciated and has made me a better Councilwoman. We have more work to do together and I look forward to working with all of you.

To our State Representatives: Thank you for taking time out of your busy schedules to be here in Cedar Grove to support our town. On behalf of the residents of Cedar Grove, we are so grateful for your service to our community and I look forward to continuing to work with you.

Cedar Grove has wonderful people working and volunteering here to make this town what it is and to me, it is a great town. We have an exceptional police department, fire department and Ambulance and Rescue Squad. These departments, as we all know, are the ones we rely on to run into danger at time when the average person runs the other way. Please know you are appreciated here in Cedar Grove. Thank you for what you do.

Our DPW, all our departments in Town Hall. You are very much appreciated. You interact with our residents daily. You keep the Town Hall going and it does not go unnoticed. It takes a team to run a Township and we have a wonderful team. It also takes a team manager. Mr. Zichelli, I cannot thank you enough for managing this team. I know how much you love sports, so I am sure you love this team reference. Thank you for all your sleepless nights and endless days. Your dedication and attention to the residents, this Council and your staff is appreciated by all. I also want to extend a big thank you for swearing me in again. It is an honor to have you do that and I look forward to another year of you managing the team! I thank you all for attending tonight. I assure the residents that I will continue to work hard every day, promote their best interest and represent Cedar Grove in a way we can all be proud of. Thank you."

Councilwoman Peterson made the following remarks:

"Good evening. I echo the sentiments the Deputy Mayor said about our Township Officials, Fire Department and DPW and especially, our LD40 representatives. You are all wonderful. I just want to thank everybody. I just finished my second term as Mayor and it is an honor and a privilege to serve this community. It's not always easy, but it's better times and it's bad times. I get to work with these amazing people, Mr. Zichelli, Ms. Forde and our Attorney. Everyone is just great here. I thank everyone and I thank you all for coming."

Councilman Maceri made the following remarks:

“Thank you, Mayor. Congratulations to you. I look forward to this year. I know you’re going to do a great job. It’s been a great three years working alongside with you. I’m really excited to see what you bring to the Council as the leader and Mayor of the Town. I also wanted to acknowledge and congratulate the Deputy Mayor. We had the pleasure of running together last election. I got to spend a lot of time with you in the rain, so I know what you’re made of. I know you’re going to do a great job. Thank you for continuing to work hard for Cedar Grove. Like the Mayor said, there is no one like you and Mayor Peterson who are truly Cedar Grove. We appreciate that very much. I did want to acknowledge that Mr. Tucci is here in the audience. We get a lot of praise for what we do, but the reality is, our job is very easy because of people like Mr. Tucci who has been a staple in this community. He has worked for so many years and has created the foundation to have such an easy job for us. Like the new mayor said, ‘These fiscal policies have started the last 30 years, under Mr. Tucci’s watch as our Town Manager, and when we picked Mr. Zichelli to be the next Town Manager, I feel like we’re so fortunate that that tradition and those policies are going to continue. So Cedar Grove is going to have 60 years of good management. I’m hoping that our Town Manager lasts that long and continues to provide services that we need for our Town. Thank you to all of our Department Heads, everybody that’s here, our family members, our LD40 Representatives who always have our back. We appreciate you coming. We appreciate all of the hard work that you do for our community, especially when we need something done with the state. Thank you again. Thank you everybody and congratulations to the two of you.”

Councilman Zazzali made the following remarks:

“Thank you, Mayor Skabich. I wanted to say thank you to Councilwoman Peterson for what she did while serving as Mayor. She did a great job. She’s very involved in Cedar Grove and I’m sure she’ll continue doing that as Councilwoman. Congratulations Mayor Skabich. Your enthusiasm serving on the Council is admirable and will benefit the residents of Cedar Grove. To Deputy Mayor Mega, congratulations to you also. You’re involved in everything Cedar Grove, so I’m sure that is going to serve the people well. Best of luck to both of you. I want to thank Assemblyman Barlas and Senator Corrado for coming out and Mr. Tucci, it’s great seeing you again. I appreciate sitting up here as a Councilman, but also as a resident. We’re fortunate to have this group in our community. Thank you.”
